

ECC's, Minnesota's and America's JOHN MAYASICH

John E. Mayasich was born May 22, 1933, in Eveleth, Minnesota. He attended Eveleth High School and participated in a number of sports. He is regarded by many as one of the best American-born hockey players of all-time even though he never played professionally. During his high school hockey career he set many individual records and helped his team achieve additional team records that still stand today. Among those records are the 46 total points he recorded at numerous state tournament games, helping his team win four consecutive state high school championships from 1948-51 with the Eveleth Golden Bears. John was a member of the 1956 Winter Olympics team that won the silver medal and the 1960 Olympic team that won the gold medal, John's 1960 Olympic jersey is on display at the USHHOF today. Mayasich reportedly turned down a number of offers from NHL teams and participated in hockey world championship tournaments in 1957, 1958, 1961, 1962, 1966, and 1969, in addition to the 1956 and 1960 Olympics.

Mayasich set the NCAA tournament record for most points scored in a game with seven against Boston College in 1954. Mayasich won the Western Collegiate Hockey Association scoring title in 1954 and 1955 and was an All-American three years in a row at his university. (Ed.: Freshman were not allowed to play varsity sports at that time.) Mayasich's #8 is the only retired number by the Historic Minnesota Golden Gophers hockey program. Mayasich was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 1976 and the Wisconsin Hockey Hall of Fame in 1989.

The Eveleth native is the Gophers' all-time leading scorer with 144 goals and 154 assists in 111 games played. That comes out to an average of about 1.3 goals per game and 2.7 points per game. Mayasich is a hockey legend - and an inovator. He was the first to use what's become the most recognizable staple of hockey: the slapshot. "I really can't remember the first time I used it," Mayasich said. "It was a big advantage for me, and it wasn't too long until others in the league began to use it. It was the equivalent to the jump shot in basketball." Not only did Mayasich destroy records in the college ranks - he still owns all of the U of M's scoring records and was equally lethal in the high school ranks. Mayasich still holds most state tournament records.

Although Mayasich was a dominant force in the college ranks, he never chose to turn pro. The Iron Ranger had other commitments. "I was in the ROTC program when I was at the U," Mayasich said. "I had a two-year obligation. I played in the 1956 Olympics that was coached by former Gophers coach John Mariucci. I got my degree in education. And with three kids in my family and only six teams in the NHL, I accepted a job at Hubbard Broadcasting. I don't regret any of it."

The late Mariucci said Mayasich compares with hockey's all-time best players. "John brought college hockey to a new plateau," Mariucci once said. "He was the Wayne Gretzky of his time. And today if he were playing pro hockey, he would simply be a bigger, stronger, back-checking Gretzky." Those are strong words, coming from one legend to another. But Mayasich said the comparison isn't quite fair. "I don't think Gretzky back-checked that much," Mayasich said. "I don't think I ever did. The comparison would be being able to see the ice in play-making and being where the puck would end up. I'm honored that John said that."

The standard Mayasich set is one that will likely never be reached, but will always be strived for. And the player Mayasich was is still something every Gophers player strives to be.

Lost and Found - is full of lost head covers and wedges. Please check with the Pro Shop if you've lost something. All Lost and Found will be donated or deposited to the garbages at the end of the year. We do not have adequate storage space to keep accumulating it.

Pro Golf Tip ~ Find your shot shape! Whether you struggle with a slice or hook. Being able to trust your shot shape can give you a great opportunity to play your best golf. A one way miss is dependable and predictable. Imagine a 40vd wide fairway. Imagine yourself aiming down the middle of the fairway, but you don't know which way the ball might go. If you miss is to the right you only have 20yds of fairway to hit. If you miss it the left you also only have 20yds of fairway to hit. Now imagine knowing every time your going to hit a fade or slice. Now you can confidently aim down the left edge of the fairway knowing the ball is going to work towards the right with your fade or slice. You now have 40yds of fairway to work with. You have effectively doubled your landing area! The same principle applies to hitting greens!
