to be done by absentee voting.

To vote absentee, an email request for an absentee ballot was due on August 30th at buhlwatercompany@yahoo.com

ABSENTEE VOTING CLOSES AT 9 a.m. Saturday, September 3.

You will receive an email link from secure.electionbuddy.com You will receive a list of those running, plus a blank spot for a write in candidate. You are allowed to vote for a maximum of 3

candidates (remember a "write in" counts as one of your three votes)

After you finish choosing your candidates, click submit in the lower right hand corner. If you accidentally click on the wrong candidate, click edit in the lower left hand corner. You may then re-do your choices

and hit the submit button. After your final submit, you will receive a confirmation email from the 100% anonymous election program.

There is only ONE vote per membership. If you requested to vote absentee, your membership will NOT be allowed to vote in person at the annual meeting via paper ballot.


