News from the House Decorating Committee

- A new deep fryer & char-broiler were purchased
- Received stainless-steel kitchen table
- The purchase of Steelite dinnerware which was approved by the Board at a cost of \$8,981.86. The House Decrating Committee had researched the purchase of dinnerware for nearly six months and with the recommendation of Hugh Duffy from California, we decided on Steelite dinnerware. Our current dinnerware is more than 25 years old. They don't retain heat properly, and are stained and chipped. The

cost of dinnerware will be somewhat offset by revenue anticipated on special occasions. Presented at the Board Meeting on April 17:

Why we need new dishes:

- 1. Current especially coffee cups are stained.
- 2. Dishes are at least 25 years old (no one knows for sure the age)
- 3. Chipped, spider-webbed.
- 4. Dinner Plates don't retain heat.
- 5. We have just 26 salad plates, so can't have sit down dinners with salad because we don't have enough plates.
- 6. Limited number of bowls for large salads and pasta dishes. Several different patterns that don't look good when setting a dinner table.
- 7. Bread and dessert plates don't match.
- 8. Hard to have weddings when we don't have adequate dinnerware.
- 9. The cost of dinnerware will be somewhat offset by revenue anticipated on special occasions.

We decided on Steelite Dinnerware

- 1. Recommendation from Hugh Duffy and what he has in California including the size dishes he recommended.
- 2. Ben Thoen has recommended these dishes as well.
- 3. Lifetime Chipping Warranty on all the dinnerware including handles.
- 4. Longevity.
- 5. We will look through old dishes and decide what to keep. We may have weddings over 120. Each year, we will buy a few more dozen so we have all new.


ECC Ramp Repair
