Eshquaguma Election Results

At the annual meeting on August 26, 2023, the ECC Nominating Committee of Kym Drain, Dwight Day and John Hovanec announced that the two incumbents – **Brian Maki** and **Terri Nelson** were re-elected and newly elected to the ECC Board is new board

member Shawn Youso.

Brian Maki was appointed as Vice-President by the ECC Board replacing Scott Strudwick who previously held that position. The ECC Board appointed Nate Lehmann to replace Scott Strudwick who recently resigned from the ECC Board. Nate will complete the remainder of Scott's one year term, which will provide one additional year of continuity to the Fundraising Liaison role.

Most members found this system easy to use and very convenient for those who were out of town or unavailable to vote in person.

Dear ECC Board, A few thoughts/observations from the 2023 Election:

• To our knowledge, no issues of concern were raised around this year's election. General feedback for online voting was favorable.

• (113) of (159) eligible memberships voted in the Board Election: (95) voted via the online Election Buddy system and (18) ballots were distributed, and collected, at the meeting.

• In 2022, the first year of online voting, (49) memberships voted; (11) online and (38) at the meeting.

• In 2021, (63) memberships voted.

• Our committee thinks electronic, online voting and vote tallying is the way to go. Election Buddy provides voter anonymity, accuracy in tallying vote totals, and substantially reduces the time and effort it takes to arrive at the election results. We intend to continue to offer this to the membership going forward.


This year the California Culinary staff and our wait staff have provided exceptional meals and service. We are excited for their return in 2024!
